- Seeking to develop understanding of Mātauranga Māori in relation to teaching practice.
- Qualified, knowledgeable and enthusiastic about teaching NCEA Physical Education and Health, as well as core Physical Education and Health.
- Flexible and willing to teach at all levels.
- An energetic and committed teacher.
- Understanding of diverse cultures and approaches, as well as being willing to use a range of teaching and learning strategies.
- Able to model the delivery of the Health and Physical Education Curriculum in accordance with school and national requirements.
- Able to contribute a sound knowledge of standards based assessment and model effective assessment processes, helping others grow their understanding and practice.
- Focused on student centred learning and building strong relationships with all members of the school community.
- Actively contributing to shared teaching resources within the department.
