Currently in Year 11 at EGGS. Involved in various activities across the School. Hoping to create a stronger connection between the OGA and the students currently attending EGGS.

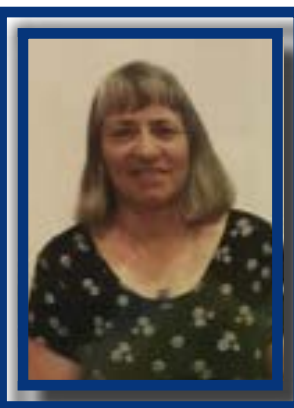
