# World Philosophy Day - St Cuthbert's College



A group of junior EGGS students attended the Centre for Science and Citizenship's, 'Social Media Ethics Workshop', held on World Philosophy Day, at St Cuthbert's College. The students enjoyed creating dialogues on a variety of aspects, for example; making distinctions between the purpose of social media and how it has come to be used, and evaluating what influences their choices about the selection of material that is posted on line. The students also responded to provocative statements in a varied manner such as: standing on either side of redline with the opportunity to cross over if persuaded by the opposition, creating word clouds, voting by standing up in a display of visual maths for polling views; they even held a debate with Barrack Obama (a projected picture) on the virtue of social media. It was a stimulating and enjoyable day for students to question their social world. 
#### How can I place a name on the Donor Wall of Honour?
