We are very proud of the 2017 NCEA results – congratulations to last year's senior students! You can see more detail on Page 2. These results represent an enormous amount of commitment and effort – everyone should feel very proud.

Last year at the Prizegiving ceremonies I said that we need help to make the plans for L Block's re-development into a modern, flexible learning environment happen. Today I am pleased to officially launch the L Block Fundraising Campaign. You can read more about this on Page 6. This is an exciting project and we are on timetable to reach the \$150,000 target by the end of the year. Students will benefit directly from this project by the end of 2019 when the re-development should be complete. Please give generously and watch for further news.

You may have seen media coverage about teacher shortages across the country. We are fortunate to be fully staffed for the start of the year. Other schools are not so lucky and unless a sustainable plan is put in place for future recruitment and retention of a high quality teaching profession, all New Zealand schools will feel the effects of staffing shortages. Principals' and teachers' professional associations at primary and secondary level continue to be in close consultation with the Ministry of Education on this issue.

2017 NCEA RESULTS

EGGS students have again achieved some outstanding NCEA results in 2017.

92.3% of Level One students achieved this qualification, 96.3% at Level Two and 89.7% of students at Level Three. 81.1% of Year 13 achieved University Entrance.

When compared to national statistics EGGs results are well above the national average. These standards of high achievement are also consistent over time.

All students are to be congratulated on their results. It is really key that students keep informed as to what the requirements of each NCEA Level Certificate are. There are special NCEA assemblies for each level in the coming weeks. There is also an information evening for parents in Term 2 on 3rd May.

CURRICULUM NEWS

From the Languages Department

Dear Parents of Language Learners,

You will find a charge on your school account for Language Perfect. This invaluable language learning app is used by all languages in the school but you pay only once for access to them all. About Week 3 of Term 1, we will be logging your daughter into the programme, so please ask her to show you. She will often choose to learn her homework vocabulary using it.

At this stage of the year, parents also often ask us how they can help their daughter with language learning when they don't speak the language themselves. As you will be aware, when not in a target language country, learning a language requires a considerable amount of memory work. If you can therefore help your daughter develop her memory skills, her language learning will be more successful. Here are some suggestions:

A little often

- ✓ Encourage your daughter to set aside a small amount of time every school night, not just the days she has language class, to learn 'a little often.' Frequent repetition is the key. In Year 9 and 10 she should be doing an hour's homework per week per subject, and in Year 11 to 13 two hours.

Test and Teach

- ✓ You could 'test' your daughter's knowledge or she could 'teach' you what she has learned.

The Meaning of Learn

- ✓ When your daughter is asked to 'learn this' for homework, it means she learns to say, write and translate the new language. Often students omit one or two of these three skills, which hinders progress.

Language in Context

- ✓ Learning new language in context helps your daughter grasp meaning and understand how words adapt and change. The School therefore provides several useful web resources free of charge. Please encourage your daughter to show you the sites that accompany her textbook and other resources that she has been directed to by her teacher.

Memory Strategies

- ✓ Encourage your daughter to discover the strategies that help her remember best. She will be given information regarding this in class.

We hope the above is useful to you. Please don't hesitate to contact us if you would like to talk further. We look forward to teaching and learning with you and your daughter this year.
