

Technovation App Designing Competition

This is the first year that EGGS has been involved in the Technovation App Designing Competition. The work towards the competition took place over half a year, in which the team Error418, comprised of Promise Akindeju, Ajay Mistry, Drishti Murara, Jessica Luo and Victoria Sun, created an app which allows overseas travelers to safely and efficiently report crime they witness to their domestic government. The team's app, Rise, made it into the top 3 national entries. The team would like to thank their mentor, María Villapol, and their digital technology teacher, Mrs Anderson, for their support throughout the half-year of work that went into the competition.

After working vigorously on the development of their app (both with the app functionality, alongside the business and finance aspect of the project), the team handed in their final work on April the 23rd, 2019 (PST). They then went on to present their pitch for Rise at the live pitch event which was held on the 26th of May. Fortunately, the team came away with a prestigious 2nd place award!



Overall, Error418 views the Technovation experience as very positive, and enlightening, due to the immense programming, economics, accounting, and design knowledge obtained by the team along the way. Alongside this, the team gained a better understanding of the dynamics required for the enhancement of team collaboration (this knowledge is evidently fundamental in a growing collaboration driven business world). They encourage EGGS to continue to be heavily involved in this competition throughout the upcoming years, and hence can't wait to see more EGGS teams entering next year!

ENROLMENT FOR 2020

Applications are invited for Years 9 - 13

HOME ZONE PLACES

Year 9 applicants who live in the home zone should submit their applications by 4 September 2019. Years 10-13 applicants who live in the home zone should contact the school.

OUT OF ZONE PLACES

Applications are invited for Ballots for Out of Zone places (only students currently enrolled at other schools are eligible).

The deadline for the receipt of applications is Wednesday 4 September 2019.

This includes applications from priority applicants ie. sisters of current students, sisters of past students, daughters of past students, daughters of Board of Trustee members and employees.

Ballots for each year level will be held on Wednesday11 September 2019.

Year 9: The Board expects to be able to offer out of zone places at Year 9 to priority groups and a limited number of general applicants, however, at this time it is unable to confirm the actual number that will be available.

Years 10, 11, 12 & 13: We will ballot for waiting lists only and any places becoming available will be filled from those lists. The Board expects to decide whether any places are available by November.

Inaugural Auckland Senior School Ethics Olympiad 2019



We participated. We collaborated. We won! On Saturday the 8th of June, two teams of EGGS' students participated in the inaugural Auckland Ethics Olympiad held at Diocesan School for Girls. 11 Private and Public secondary schools took part in the Olympiad from a wide ranging area; as far south as Waikato Diocesan School for Girls, to Waiheke High School, and as north as Kirsten School.





The girls had to discuss ethical scenarios such as: the morality of De-Extinction, Drone Wars, Data Violence, Private Funding in Academia, and even an Unauthorised Dumping of a romantic partner context. After presenting their moral standpoint on these issues the students were then interrogated by three judges from the Auckland University Department of Philosophy. The students showed particular strength in raising perceptive, supportive and divergent ethical arguments on the fly' in response. So ingenious in fact, that our senior team was awarded first place and a gold medal.

We are proud of our Olympiad thinkers and also of the enthusiastic student participation in the co-curricular group across the school. We will now begin recruiting for the Junior Ethics Olympiad for Year 9 students, which is being held later in the year.

A special thank you to, Dr Claire Gavin who prepared the students for the Olympiad in a fun and extensive manner, alongside the support of Mr Jahred Dell and Ms Amanda Lawrence.

Year 13 Drama Production - Risk

Risk was performed on the 29th and 30th of May in the Raye Freedman Arts Centre. The play reflected the lives of five teenagers that are taking different kinds of risks in their lives; drinking, stealing, bullying, hiding away from life and finding their own identity.

The play was written by teenagers and therefore sat beautifully with the cast who performed. The production, a mix of dance and drama, was a reflection of issues that the students themselves are dealing with and the rehearsal process challenged them to question their own views and by proxy the audience was then challenged, especially parents and teachers watching. We were reminded that the students come into our classrooms each day are complex and human, not always primed to absorb what teachers need to teach them. The students were so proud of themselves and we had wonderful feedback from the audience, as well as a very special standing ovation.

This was also a wonderful learning opportunity for students interested in technical aspects of theatre. Vaughan Williams is one of the technicians employed by the school and has shown himself to be an excellent teacher over recent years. He enabled student Grace Wilkie to programme, mix the colours and design lighting for this production, for Sarah Peyton-Beverley to feel confident using the sound desk and Eva Verwoerd to adapt and run the projections for the performance. These skills could lead to very viable careers in the industry and are a really special part of the relationship that Drama and Arts and Culture has with the Raye Freedman Arts Centre staff.
