The NCEA review consultation period is open until 16 September – see link on this page. I would like to encourage students and parents to have your say. There will be many different viewpoints on what makes a good qualifications system and across the globe there are a number of systems that serve students well; each with its own distinctive philosophical and structural approach. What we know is that NCEA in its present form has provided a qualification that has enabled EGGS students to gain access to tertiary study across the globe; to pursue a wide variety of future pathways and to enjoy academic success in their secondary education. What we also know is that improvements could be made to the qualification. Any changes that we may move to in the future will be based on what will serve students well – while they are learning here at Epsom, and for their future plans. We are committed to providing:

- broad and deep curriculum learning, knowledge and skills
- · academic rigour
- a rich co-curricular experience
- communication and collaboration skills
- the development of critical engagement, critical thinking, problem solving and student agency
- up-to-date, future-focused knowledge and skills for a world that is experiencing exponential rates of change

### Matariki Hikoi

As you may know, Matariki is approaching. This is a significant festival on the Māori calendar which indicates the start of a new year. It is a time to gather together, to celebrate the unique place in which we live and give respect to the land on which we live. We can reflect on the previous year and consider new beginnings and aspirations. It is signalled by the appearance of a 7 star cluster, known in Aotearoa as Matariki and known elsewhere as the Pleiades or Subaru.

Last year, our school decided to celebrate this festival with a sunrise walk up our local mountain, Maungawhau / Mt Eden. Following on from the success of last year's event, the Matariki hikoi will now be an annual school community event.

This year we will be gathering outside the Raye Freedman Arts Centre, Silver Road at 5.30am, leaving for the hikoi at 5.40am on the morning of Friday 15 June (cancellation date Friday 22 June).
