NCEA - Top Scholars

Last week we celebrated the highest levels of success with the presentation of Top Scholars' Awards at assembly. These are awarded to no more than the top 5% of the cohort based on the course they have completed in that year. Congratulations to all of these students.

Scholarship

Scholarship is an extra examination to recognise the highest levels of achievement in the country. Approximately 3% of the cohort sitting Level 3 in the particular subject nationwide are awarded Scholarship. Monetary awards range from \$500 to \$2000 for each of the first three years of study.

In 2018 EGGS students gained a total of 72 Scholarships including 4 awarded at Outstanding level. These scholarships were spread across 21 subjects, showing a depth of achievement at the highest level across a broad range of curriculum areas.

Outstanding Scholarships were gained in Design & Visual Communication, Music, Geography and Biology.

FOUNDATION NEWS Donor Wall of Honour


