

Year 13 Unicorn and Vacuum Cleaners Conference Day

Dear parents and caregivers

Congratulations to students who were involved in the cast, orchestra and crew of the Production at Auckland Grammar School recently, and congratulations to the organisers of the Year 13 Unicorn and Vacuum Cleaners Conference Day.

Students will be at home on Wednesday of next week – parents and caregivers have received an email regarding this combined secondary and primary teacher unions' strike day. In the following week the annual mid-year Staff Planning Day is on the Tuesday after Queen's Birthday Weekend, and students will be at home that day also.

Educators throughout the country are deeply concerned about conditions and pay rates for teachers. The concern is, of course, also related to recruitment and retention of a quality teaching workforce into the future. University graduates are not choosing secondary teaching in the numbers usual in the past and a major factor in this is that initial pay rates, and then steps for advancement in pay, are not attractive.

Yesterday I received notification from Public Health relating to the measles outbreak currently being experienced in a number of areas. Learning EGG

Measles in Auckland schools

Please vaccinate your child or young person if they have not had one measles (MMR) vaccine. It is free at your GP.

Students in a class with someone who has measles may be asked to stay home for one to two weeks, if they have had no MMR vaccinations.

Students with one or more MMR vaccinations can still attend school. Check your child's immunisation records in their Well Child/Tamariki Ora book or ring your GP clinic.

Tell your GP or after hours clinic if you suspect measles before you arrive, so you don't infect others.

<u>Symptoms</u>: cough, runny nose, fever, sore red eyes, then a rash.


Chamber Music




How can I place a name on the Donor Wall of Honour?






Underwater Hockey
