Dear parents, caregivers and students

On Wednesday we welcomed families to the first Pasifika Fono for the year, followed by large numbers in the Marjory Adams Hall for the two sessions of the NCEA Information Evening – see Page 2 for the links. It is really good to be able to engage with families, and we look forward to being able to again, at the Term 1 Student Led Conferences on 31 March and 1 April, just before the Easter break.

This week we have received updated NCEA results, with both Level 3 and UE rates going up: Level 2 – 94.5%

Level 3 – 89.1%

UE - 84% (topping results over the last five years). Well done Year 13 2020!

Some key reminders:

You will have already received an email outlining the purpose of these conferences, specific to each year level, and key information about these days. Included in that email are the instructions about how to make bookings. Please note that bookings close on Monday 29th of March. Year 9-11 Conferences start at 10.00am on Wednesday 31st March and Year 12 start at 11.50am after the Learning Summit. Year 9 - 12 Conferences start at 9.30am on Thursday 1st April.

These student-tutor-whanau conferences are student-led and focus on how the student is settling in to the demands of their new year level and it is an opportunity to plan ahead for the rest of the year. We know that student agency and a positive working relationship with families has an important impact on student progress and achievement and these conferences are a valuable part of that.

Please note that if we are at alert level 2, we are unable to have parents on site. Should we be in any level other than level 1, we will activate our online conferencing system which has been set up in the background. These conferences are about coming together in person where possible – Kanohi ki te kanohi. This link will only be used should we be unable to have parents on site.

Gateway Programme @ Epsom Girls Grammar School

EGGS is fortunate to be able to offer the Gateway Programme to a select group of year 12 and 13 students. Gateway is funded by the Tertiary Education Commission and designed to support school students' transition into the workforce by offering them workplace learning while at secondary school.

We work with our selected students to find them work placements (generally about 5 days) in workplaces that align with their career interests. In the past we have had students placed in a broad range of business sectors including construction, agriculture, equine, legal, marketing, finance, retail, hospitality, travel, early childhood, and engineering.

Swimming Programme

Our swimming programme has started in school this week. This is part of the Physical Education programme, with the purpose of giving Year 9 and 10 students who need help to improve their swimming or those that can't swim, the opportunity to learn. The programme is taught by Janine Ibbs, a professional swimming teacher, and students who have been selected (through the testing that has been carried out in PE lessons earlier in the term), attend one swimming lesson each week, until they graduate from the programme. We are very grateful to the School Board for their continued support of this initiative as it has given many students the opportunity to develop skills to be safe in the water. This is a vital life skill for everyone to have in New Zealand.

This term, there are 150 Year 9 students (36% of all Year 9's) and 96 Year 10 students (22% of all Year 10's) in the programme.





Year 12 student and sailor Sophia Morgan was selected for her first Olympic Games in Tokyo, representing Fiji. Sophia mentioned she is feeling honoured and excited about this once in a lifetime opportunity. Sophia qualified for the Tokyo games after achieving the best-placed sailor from Oceania at the 2020 World Championships in Australia. Based on her success, she was offered the opportunity to train with the NZ Youth Sailing Squad while studying at Epsom Girls Grammar School. Sophia said she hoped to overcome the challenges which included improving her fitness level and learning a lot. Well done Sophia!
