# **WILL THE GENDER PAY GAP AFFECT EGGS STUDENTS?**



The World Economic Forum has reported that the gender pay gap will take over 250 years to close; so, yes, unfortunately, students here at EGGS will most likely have to endure salary inequity in their future working lives. Jo Cribb, former Chief Executive for the Ministry for Women says: "We don't want any of our daughters joining the workforce knowing they're going to earn 10 per cent less than our sons". Many of the solutions to this problem need to happen on a large scale such as companies sharing salary information, equal division of athome labour, strengthening child-care provision

etc., but there are also things individuals can do to limit the risk of future pay inequity. As career educators we want to make sure that our students have crucial information about salary rates including salary negotiation skills and access to neutral sources of salary information. The more information you can gather, the more likely it is that you will be able to negotiate salary rates in an effective manner. Here are some resources you may want to refer to:

- an aspirational and fun little TikTok video on salary negotiation which includes a good script to modify.
