Numeracy – 95.6% of Year 11 students gained Numeracy and a Numeracy programme will operate this year for those few who have not yet achieved it. (This rate of 95.6% compares with a NZ Decile 9 schools' rate of 86.2%).

97% of 2021 Year 11 students earned at least 20 credits which is the number they can bring up to count towards Level 2 NCEA. This means that for Level 2 NCEA they have just 60 to gain this year.

Congratulations to all three cohorts!

These are outstanding results, particularly the Level 3 result which sets a new record in achievement at this level.

Being able to hold the school examinations was crucial, as students provided evidence of meeting an Achievement Standard at either Achieved, Merit or Excellence. We knew that students had prepared well for these exams and that they were ready to sit. The NZQA system of Unexpected Event Grades (UEGs) simply meant that students did not have to prove a second time, that they had earned the result they gained. It was also good to see students sitting the November/December exams who wished to improve their grades.

At Level 2 the results sit at a level commensurate with results over previous years. We are delighted with these students who were the first cohort who did a partial Level 1 programme in 2020. This data demonstrates that the students were well prepared to undertake their Level 2 qualification and that, as expected, there has been no adverse effect on achievement from the Year 11 programme change.

The 2021 Year 11, Year 12, Year 13 cohorts, and their teachers, can be justly proud of their outstanding achievement, especially out of two years of pandemic lockdowns for significant periods.

#### **NZ Scholarship Examinations**

Yesterday the 2021 New Zealand Scholarship Examination results were published. Epsom students gained 71 Scholarships; 62 Scholarships and 9 at Outstanding level. Four students gained three Scholarships and ten students gained two Scholarships. It is wonderful to see each year the spread of subjects - Scholarships were gained in 20 different subjects this year, showing depth across the curriculum. Congratulations to all students who gained NZ Scholarships.

Key reminders:

- If a student is sick they are to remain at home. If symptomatic seek medical advice about testing for Covid-19
- Scan and record movements in evenings and weekends important for contact tracing

Auckland traffic is a daily difficulty – please remember to leave early enough so that students are on time to school – they need to be onsite by 8.30am and to be at tutor group no later than 8.35am.



Reminder – if a student wishes to participate in a co-curricular activity that has a charge attached, the charge needs to be paid before the student can start the activity. As the co-curricular programme starts for the year parents can view charges through the KAMAR web portal.

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## **Sustainability**

(Pool heating system upgrade expected to save enough power run 30 family homes for a year)

This summer our pool heating and ventilation system had an extreme makeover to provide a fresher and cooler environment for users, spectators and teaching staff. The new system supplies twice as much fresh air to the pool hall to provide better control over humidity levels. Despite the increased fresh air supply the new system is expected to reduce electricity usage by almost a third when compared to performance prior to the 2021 level 4 lockdown. This is equivalent to taking 16 cars off the road and will help the school continue to reduce its energy usage.

Joshna, a member of the 2020 Sustainability Team which implemented the schools ISO 50001 energy management system, was interested to see how the project was progressing and is shown here holding part of the part of the Huber & Ranner heat recovery system which recovers waste heat from the exhaust air. The other heating coil is connected to a new air source heat pump which also provides heating to the pool water.

This new system is expected to reduce electricity usage by almost \$50,000 in the first year and over the summer Joshna and Bronwyn McGill the (School Energy Manager) have been actively engaging with this year's sustainability team students to ensure they are ready to monitor and report on the performance of the system to see if it is as efficient as the expected. Updates to follow later in the year.
