

The vibrant hum of term three co-curricular events has almost felt like a return to school life as it used to be. In recent weeks we have celebrated the Chinese Extravaganza, the Year 12 and 13 Drama curriculum productions, the KBB Music Festival, as well as the return of Incubate. This Visual Art showcase was made all the more delightful by the inclusion of the Year 10 Crowns exhibition. Congratulations to all performers, participants, artists, teachers, student helpers and thank you to those who came along to support these events.

This term has also been an outstanding one for Sport and we wish our Hockey and Football teams all the very best for their finals this week. Congratulations to the students who placed at the New Zealand Duathlon Championships this week - see details in Sport. What an experience for the EGGS Ultimate team who represented New Zealand at the World Junior Ultimate Championships in Wroclaw, Poland. Best of luck to our Junior Premier Basketball team who have made it into the semi finals at the Auckland Championships.

Earlier in the week the Associate Minister of Education announced changes to NCEA for 2022 in recognition of the impact that COVID-19 and other winter illnesses have had on teaching, learning and assessment this year. Students will be entitled to 1 Learning Recognition Credit (LRC) for every 5 credits earned (with a maximum of 10 at Level 1 and a maximum of 8 at Levels 2 and 3). Certificate endorsements have been reduced to 46 credits at Merit or Excellence level, instead of the usual 50. To be awarded University Entrance, students will need 14 credits in each of two UE Approved Subjects, and 12 credits in a third UE Approved Subject (they will also need to attain NCEA Level 3 and meet the regular literacy and numeracy requirements). The submission dates for some externally assessed portfolios have also been extended by one week.

It is important to note that there is no mention of the 2021 Unexpected Event Grade strategy as that tool was fit for the 2021 context. We do not anticipate the reinstatement of UEGs and urge students to make every effort to demonstrate what they know in our School Examinations. As always, this is the opportunity for students to generate a result should they be unable to sit their NZQA examinations in November. School examinations for Year 12 and 13 start on Thursday 15th of September. Year 11 will also have some examinations in the exam period - see the year level email for details.


- If you turn 18 before the 8th of October, you're eligible to yote in the 2022 Local Elections!

Jessica Tyson is mostly known to us because of her Celebrity Treasure Island fame. Jess was also Miss World NZ in 2018, and started the charity Brave, which supports prevention of sexual violence. Jessica encouraged our young wahine to be proud of being Māori, and talked about the doors it can open for them in the future. Jess exemplifies courage and commitment as she juggles many roles in her life. This event was so well received by our rangatira. It was a special time for our students to come together and be celebrated, see what other wahine have accomplished, and hopefully gain some excitement about their own future career prospects. 












EGGS Writing Group

Founders Awards Event 2022

The OGA honoured the 2022 EGGS Founders Award recipient, Jan Beagle, on Tuesday 21st June 2022 for **Outstanding Achievement in Diplomacy and Multilateralism**.

The event was held online via Zoom for the first time – and, given Jan lives in Rome, after many years living in New York and Geneva, this was ideal. She was able to join us from overseas, along with her friends and family from around the world.

Jan's citation was read by Head Prefect Dharshna Baskar. Also, Jan's classmate from Epsom days, Dr Jane Skeen, shared her tribute to her lifelong friend. They have known each other for 60 years, having first met in Form 1 at Remuera Intermediate School.



Jan attended EGGS from 1964 to 1967. She gained a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Arts in History with first class honours from the University of Auckland. Since then, she has forged an impressive diplomatic career, initially working for the New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs, including as a delegate to the United Nations, and then holding a number of significant roles within the UN.

In January 2020 Jan took up her current position as the Director-General of the International Development Law Organization (IDLO), having been elected by Member Parties in November 2019.

A massive congratulations to these students, and a huge thank you to the parents that helped out on the day!










Road Race Champs
