Applications are invited for Years 9 - 13

HOME ZONE PLACES

Year 9 applicants who live in the home zone should submit their applications by 7 September 2022. Years 10-13 applicants who live in the home zone should contact the school.

OUT OF ZONE PLACES

Applications are invited for Ballots for Out of Zone places (only students currently enrolled at other schools are eligible).

The deadline for the receipt of applications is Wednesday 7 September 2022.

This includes applications from priority applicants ie. sisters of current students, sisters of past students, daughters of past students, daughters of Board of Trustee members and employees.

Ballots for each year level will be held on Wednesday 14 September 2022.

Year 9: The Board expects to be able to offer out of zone places at Year 9 to priority groups and a limited number of general applicants, however, at this time it is unable to confirm the actual number that will be available.

Years 10, 11, 12 & 13: We will ballot for waiting lists only and any places becoming available will be filled from those lists. The Board expects to decide whether any places are available by November.

Duān Wǔ Jié, Kūng Fū, Yum Cha, FóGuāngShān Temple and Mooncake making @ Learning Languages

Our Mandarin Chinese learners have been really busy experiencing many aspects of Chinese culture in the last few months, from **Duān Wǔ (Dragon Boat Festival)** to **Chinese Martial Arts** and from **visiting a Buddhist Temple** to sampling **scrumptious Chinese tapas (Yum Cha)**, every year level had insights into what these celebrations are about and the food and rituals associated with them. Last week, we also learned how to make mooncake while appreciating a Chinese poem about how "things in life that happen in a cycle just like the cycle of the moon" (人有悲欢离合,月有阴晴圆缺) by 苏轼 Sūshì dated 1076.

Prior to each event or school trip, students learned about its history and the key language that goes with the occasion. Our learners further benefited from seeing our guest speakers in action (a kung-fu master and two Chinese pastry bakers). The students also had the opportunity to learn the etiquette around eating at a Chinese table and how and what the locals do.
