

Basketball Nationals







On October 2nd, our Premier Basketball team travelled down to Palmerston North and competed in the New Zealand Secondary School Championship, which they qualified for during Winter Tournament week. This is the first nationals EGGS has competed at in 8 years which is a huge achievement in itself for our young team! Game play began on Oct 3rd where in a strong pool, EGGS finished 4th, winning important games against New Plymouth Girls' High School and Auckland-rivals, St Kentigern College. This secured their spot in the 9-16th playoffs to cross over with Napier Girls' High School. With a huge team effort, EGGS had a convincing win over Napier (91-71), securing top 12 and their initial tournament goal. The next game against Waimea; the team who finished 3rd in their pool, did not quite go in our favour, but after 5 days competing in the top level secondary schools basketball competition, the girls had one final game against Rangiora High School for 11/12th. The team fought hard throughout their final game, but weren't able to catch up having trailed since the 1st quarter with a final score of 81-67.

EGGS finished 12th in the country, 12 placers higher than the previous EGGS team! This is a HUGE achievement for a first time team and is a testament to their hard work and determination throughout the season. Congratulations to you all, we are so proud! A massive thank you to Wayne (Head Coach), Tania (Assistant Coach), Oralee (Manager) and Briana (Sports Coordinator) for their massive efforts and support.

Mountain Biking

On Sunday the 25th of September, the mountain biking team had their final race of the Auckland Schools Mountain Biking Series.
