National Latin Exam Results

In Term 1 our Years 10-12 Latin students sat the National Latin Exam, an international exam run by the American Classical League in the US and sat by over 100,000 Latin learners around the world. It tests students on both their Latin language knowledge and their familiarity with Roman history, culture and mythology. This year we have had 3 students gain certificates and medals in this exam: that they have achieved so highly is a testament to their broad learning and understanding of the ancient world.

A Gold Summa Cum Laude ("with the highest praise") medal was awarded to Abbie Mackay in Year 11, a Silver Maxima Cum Laude ("with greatest praise") medal was awarded to Ansonia Chen, also in Year 11, and a Magna Cum Laude ("with great praise") certificate was

awarded to Chloe Latimer in Year 10.

NZ's Women in Engineering Course



In the second week of the school holidays 50 Year 11 female students from across New Zealand were invited to participate in a Women in Engineering course. We really enjoyed the opportunity to learn more about Physics and Math in the real world and loved hearing from lots of incredible female engineers and engineering students. We got to participate in lots of awesome activities across three days including making biofuel cars fueled by hydrogen gas that we retrieved from water. We got to explore the University City and Newmarket campus and learnt all about the amazing 3D printing work some of which includes 3D printing food! We got to see the formula SAE (the student led, run, and created electric formula cars), we got to hear from some inspiring speakers including Eva Hakansson who made and raced the world's fastest electric motorcycle, Eva has also started her very own business KiwiFil where she and her husband make 3D printing filament (the first in NZ). We got to talk to a panel of some incredible female engineering university students and hear all about their experiences as well as lots of other amazing things. The whole event was free (including food) and we highly recommend next year's Year 11s to give this amazing opportunity a go.

Year 11 Drama

On Wednesday 25th May, Year 11 Drama students viewed and participated in a performance by Anders Falstie-Jensen called "Back to Square One". The play was interactive and was made by Anders in response to the first lockdown. He initially made the play for his neighbours and performed it in his driveway, before touring neighbourhoods and schools. The story is about his 95 year old grandmother who lives in an apartment in Denmark. Through chalk drawn on the concrete, Anders invites us to consider how lockdown affected his grandmother's day to day life. This personal family story was woven together with Nordic folklore in the form of a story told to Anders as a child by his grandmother.

The play asked us to consider the connections we have with others around the world, the impact change has on us and the condensing and confusion of time when our routine is taken away. It was a poignant and reflective story which concluded with shared kai (homemade Danish pastries and salty liquorish).
