





These are items and activities that are not funded within the school budget and therefore contribute to maintaining high standards and opportunities for which EGGS is known.

Grants from this fund are usually between \$100 and \$400 each.

Some of the successful applicants include:

- Funding towards the purchase of garden plants and equipment
