For Year 12 and 13 students NZ Scholarship results were also celebrated. Hellen Ding was one of 51 students across New Zealand awarded the Outstanding Scholar Award, and Hailey Kwak was awarded a perfect score in Art Painting to be Top Scholar in New Zealand for the subject. 
Assessment and NCEA Information Evening

2022 NCEA Results

EGGS students continue to achieve consistently high NCEA results. In 2022 91.6% gained their Level 2 NCEA Certificate and 88.7% gained their Level 3 NCEA Certificate. 78% of Year 13 achieved University Entrance. These figures can be seen in the following graph.

Top Scholar Awards

On Thursday morning 16 February we celebrated the achievements of our senior students from 2022 with our Scholars Assembly. Scholars awards are given to those who have achieved in the top 5% of their cohort or year level. The calculation takes into account all credits sat in the single 2022 calendar year, including if any credits gained at a higher level.

We also recognised the outstanding success EGGS has had in NZ Scholarship 2022. 48 Scholarships gained by our students, including 5 Special Outstanding Scholarships. mention goes to the following students on their achievements -Raisa Chugh (Outstanding Scholarship in Statistics and Scholarships in Biology and Chemistry), Hellen Ding (Outstanding Scholarships in Art History and Biology and Scholarships in Calculus and Statistics), Kyubeen Kim (Scholarships in Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Statistics), Hailey Kwak (Top Scholar in Painting) and Tianling Lu (Outstanding Scholarship in Design and Visual Communication and Scholarships in Biology and Music).

NZQA has also recognised Hellen's incredible achievement by awarding her a 2022 Outstanding Scholar Award. This prestigious award is presented to a very limited number of students across the country.


