

Year 13 French Debate

Last term, the Year 13 French students were learning to talk about environmental issues in French. The topic culminated in a debate all in French that lasted two periods. Students were randomly allocated a form of energy that could be used to generate electricity: wind power, solar power, biofuel, nuclear power or hydropower. They had to argue in French that their form of energy should be used to fully power a newly discovered island. The debate was a great opportunity for students to use their French in a skilful and complex way as well as to expand their knowledge about the topic.
