The Year 10 Team A has shown outstanding abilities, remaining within the first 3 teams out of over 130 teams until the 85% mark. They have been placed 1st out of all teams participating until the 60% mark, which was a record for Epsom Girls Grammar School.



The Year 10 Team B has shown a very sturdy, consistent and remarkable progression, scoring 95 at the end of the competition which placed them 9th overall (tied with other teams). The Year 10 students were able to complete their final year of participating in Mathex with a huge sense of achievement and confidence.

The Year 9 teams have shown amazing skills and performed very well at their competition, despite this year being their first year competing in high school Mathex. Both teams were able to stay in the top 25% until the 60% mark and have achieved great results. We are excited to see their performance next year!

#### Apollo Projects NZ Short Course Championships - Hawke's Bay Regional Aquatic Centre - 8 - 12 August 2023

A number of our swimmers travelled down to Hawkes Bay to compete in the last national pool competition of the year, the most prestigious of the short course events while representing their regional clubs. All 4 of them excelled, and showed some really awesome results including a number of age group medals, open age group finals, and some well deserved personal best times.



Emily Rope (13 yrs) came away with 3/3 personal bests in her breaststroke events, and 2 bronze medals in the 100 and 200 Breastroke. Louise Ecclestone (16 yrs) earned 2 bronze medals in the 100 and 200 IM for her age group, 4 personal bests, and made 3 appearances in the open B & C finals across her events. Olivia Bates (15 yrs) also made 4 appearances in open B & C finals, placing 2nd in the B final of the 400 IM, as well as a very commendable 5th place in her age group final for this event. Abby Davidson (17-18 yrs) earned silver in both 50 and 200 Breastroke, bronze in the 100 Breastroke, and bronze in both 4x50 IM girls and 4x100 IM girls open relays for her club. She also placed 7th in both 50 and 200 Breastroke open A finals, and completed over half the competition with a fractured finger!! What a way to finish the competition year for our students!!

We have 2 strong Junior teams coming to represent EGGS at the Nationals on September 23rd in Palmerston North.







#### **The Seniors**

The Senior A have fought hard this season. They started without one of the captains who was training in Europe. But they have worked hard as a team, supporting each other to place second overall in the series.

On finals day they also placed second. However, the team produced the fastest time of the season of 23 min 45 sec for 16km with an average speed of 40.9kph to claim the fastest team Cup. They take that speed and confidence into the nationals where it will be close racing again.

Tegan Feringa placed second in the individual points race for under 20 girls.
