Please note that all letters will be in capitals and the maximum number is 8.

The embroidery of letters is restricted to a specific area of the bag due to machine set up. This means that the more letters you choose, the smaller they will appear. E.g if you choose 2 letters, the height will be 43cm and width 95cm; 3 letters will be a height of 35cm and width 14cm. Below is an example of what 8 letters would look like compared to 3, if you choose this option.

The EGGS logo will appear on one side of the bags and initials/name on the other side.

There is a strict no returns policy. Because of this, please be very careful when placing your order. Due to the washed nature of this fabric, differences in colour shades exist, this is normal and part of the beauty. Colour may rub off onto other surfaces and is designed to fade over time.
