# **CURRICULUM NEWS**

#### Year 12 Biology

Year 12 biology students are looking at the use of enzymes in industry. This lesson was using an enzyme to cut the lactose sugar. We know it works if we get glucose present at the end of the practical which we did get. The technique is similar to how they make cats milk as young mammals once weaned do not cope well with lactose.







#### **Sustainability**

In the school holidays, Fawn and Chloe, our Year 13 Sustainability leaders had the amazing opportunity to be part of a 3-day sustainability wānanga. They spent a rainy day at the beautiful Papatūānuku Kokiri Marae after the most incredible welcoming with other sustainability representatives. They learned about te Tiriti o Waitangi and te tiriti's important role in sustainability actions. They also got a tour of the garden grounds where it was really uplifting to see how much difference a community led initiative could make when taking action against issues seems impossible. On the second day, they were out for a



hīkoi where they got a chance to connect with like-minded people and meet some knowledgeable people working in sustainability (like Frazer the Frog Man who knows everything about plant species) as they walked 5km along the Puhinui awa, picking up rubbish. They

finished the day on kayaks around the harbour and really enjoyed the holistic approach, being able to be out and amongst it instead of just discussing action plans in a classroom. They finished the wānanga at the Botanic Gardens with some cool workshops before coming together as a group to write our action plans and affirm them to each other. Both the leaders found the wānanga really uplifting and guiding us in the right direction for the rest of the year. A big thank you to Mrs Mirti, the TIC and Auckland Council for letting us be a part of it.





#### Year 10 Whakawhanaungatanga

Year 10 ākonga Māori enjoyed some whakawhanaungatanga earlier this week. After introductions and some games the rōpu brainstormed ways that they can connect more at school, how their voice can be captured around the school and events coming up. #### **Library - Graphic Novels**

By combining visual art with literary and cinematic techniques, innovative and stimulating storylines can be found in graphic novels. They not only promote oral and visual literacy, but can also help foster a love for reading.

The graphic novel fiction collection in the EGGS Library is one of the first things you see when you enter the Library foyer. Each year the collection grows as new and engaging graphic novels are published and added to the collection.

They often tell a stand-alone story with a complex plot using illustrations. Graphic novels from the collection often feature high in the lists of most issued items each year.



They can provide an exciting reading experience for all levels or readers. The images can help readers decode and comprehend text. At the same time the concise language used can show how ideas and storylines can be communicated in short, pithy text.

### **STUDENT SUPPORT NEWS** GoodSpace Schools Wellbeing Survey

This year we will again be running a confidential survey with our Years 12 and 13 students, to help students reflect on their wellbeing and for us to be able to identify needs and offer support. The survey is a youth friendly secure online survey, endorsed by the Ministry of Education and based on an evidence-based framework for schools to be able to identify students who may need support.

Our intended plan is to survey Year 12 in week 4 or week 6 of Term 2 and Year 13 at the end of Term 2 or beginning of Term 3 during a tutor time. The survey takes 10-15 minutes and results are known immediately to our School Counsellors. Once a possible need for support has been identified students will be offered the opportunity to meet with a counsellor at school. Any student is also welcome to make an appointment with a counsellor to discuss any aspect of their wellbeing at any time, should they wish to.
