Annual Parent Donation - Reminder

It has been an unusual year already with so many pressures felt acutely by our community such as unforeseen weather events and strike action affecting whether schools can open, as well as the ongoing effects of the current economic climate hitting home hard for so many of us.

The financial impact on Epsom Girls Grammar School continues to be managed well, although we continue to operate with a reduced income stream. We rely more than ever on the Annual Parent Donation to continue to provide the depth of student learning that the school and the parent community expects.

As a large school, we are disadvantaged by the present staffing formula. If the Board did not supplement the staffing provision to the significant extent that it does at present, our class sizes would be larger at all year levels and we would also be unable to offer the breadth of curriculum subjects that we currently offer.

The School Board is committed to developing a sense of inclusion and local and global connectedness through providing a broad range of learning and leadership opportunities. Respecting the mana of all is reflected in our values of compassion, courage, curiosity and community. Consequently, each year the Board invites parents and caregivers to make the Annual Parent Donation to cover all costs associated with the delivery of the Epsom curriculum.

Your donation enables us to do this by providing:

- additional teaching staff to allow smaller class sizes and a wide range of subjects
- additional support staff in learning areas to allow teachers to focus on teaching and learning
- additional support staff in co-curricular areas to provide support for sports, arts and culture, learning and community activities
- additional counsellors to provide pastoral support
- state of art facilities such as the Raye Freedman Arts Centre, Aquatic Centre, Joyce Fisher Sports Centre
- · extensive infrastructure and a professional support network for eLearning

We are almost halfway through the year, so in order for us to effectively provide our daughters with the standard of education our community expects, we ask that you make the donation as soon as possible, as well as other costs associated with courses and those that enhance learning and participation in their broader education and positive experience at Epsom Girls Grammar School.

CURRICULUM NEWS Te Rangi-i-totongia ai Te Ihu a Tamatekapua (Rangitoto)

"Hoki ki tõu maunga kia purea ai koe ki ngā hau o Tāwhirimātea"

Return to your mountain so you can be cleansed by the four winds of Tawhirimatea





E ngā mātāwaka o te motu, nei rā te mihi e rere ana ki runga i ngā hau e whā tēnā koutou katoa. This term, our Year 10 Te Reo Māori students began our kauapapa (subject) of learning about Ngā Maunga Tapu o Tāmaki or the Sacred Mountains of Auckland. The goal is for each student to gain a connection and an understanding of the rich, deep cultural history of the mountains that reside within the boundary of Tāmaki, through a Māori lense. To initiate this huge undertaking we embarked on a journey of climbing Auckland's youngest mountain Rangitoto.



Students had been learning about the mountain in the leadup to our ascension. One fact they learnt was one of the true names of Rangitoto which is, Te Rangi-i-totongia ai Te Ihu a Tamatekapua or the day Tamatekapua's blood was shed.

Rangitoto stands 260m high, 2/3 of the sky tower, with the return walking track taking around 2 hours. It was definitely an arduous, and at times, treacherous journey crossing mounds of sharp ancient scoria and a pathway of slippery slopes, due to the recent rains. There were times where students were faced with tiredness, fatigue and some reached a point of giving up but all persevered, making it to the tihi (peak) of the mountain with smiles from ear to ear and a sense of accomplishment.

At the summit students enjoyed lunch and were regaled with pūrākau of how the maunga came to be. They played māori orientated games like pūkana and pakō with onlookers clapping while listening to the laughter, and pure joy resounding all around the top of the mountain.

When we carefully descended the mountain we were fortunate enough to meet one of the tangata whenua from Ngāi Tai (the iwi who lives on the mountain) who shared his knowledge with the students, they thanked him by singing a waiata to acknowledge his ancestry and the connections made with the mountain known as Rangitoto.

Some comments from the students:

He aha tētahi mea i ako koe e pā ana ki a Rangitoto? What is something that you learnt about Rangitoto?

I learnt that when you walk in through the waharoa (entrance) that you are being blessed. How the giant threw a rock (Rangitoto) to show the other giants that he was strong

He aha tētahi mea tino pai māu? What was the best thing for you?

Playing pūkana and bonding with others that I didn't know too well. When we got to the top of the mountain, we were pointing out where our mountains were.

He aha tētahi wero māu? What was the most chellenging for you?

The most challenging part was trying to find the mountain i am doing my mahi on in class. The most challenging thing for me was the last few steps up to the top.

The student-run production was directed by Year 13 Drama Leaders, Jessica Roulston and Mariana Nascimento Cavalcanti, with support from Jove Cheung & a fabulous group of Year 9 to 13 students.
