# CURRICULUM NEWS Drama "Castaway Airlines"



On Friday 2nd June, Drama students had the opportunity to see one of their own Drama Teachers performing in a comedy play at The Basement Theatre. They were highly entertained by Miss Jane Wills performing as a Flight Attendant on the very shaky "Castaway Airlines". The audience were the passengers on the bumpy ride and participation was encouraged. Students were able to see how Physical Theatre can be used to create character and situation with humour and impact.

#### Year 11 Drama - Highwic House

Year 11 Drama students are creating site-based drama to be performed at the historic home, Highwic House, on Gillies Ave. We had our first visit in week 6 to begin our research about the house and its occupants and likely visitors. Students will now prepare devised scenes to perform in the house in Victorian costume. The performances will take place at the end of the term and whanau will be invited to attend.









## **Philosophy Department**

#### Year 12 Talking Ethics class

This class are doing the school's first Psychology standard. In it they conduct and evaluate an experiment on "The Stroop Effect". They are gaining valuable scientific literacy skills and finding out about the psychological theories that explain the effect. Collecting data from other students in the school has been useful for: collaborative learning, leadership skills, cross curricular and cross year level interactions.

#### **The Senior Ethics Olympiad**

The Ethics Olympiad is a vehicle for developing skills in communication, critical thinking and respectful discourse while dealing with important and interesting ethical issues. Unlike debating, students can take the position they want at an Ethics Olympiad. They work as a team, with teams from other schools to come up with the best possible answer to difficult ethical questions. It is run across schools in New Zealand, Australia, Hong Kong, Singapore and India. We were part of one of two North Island olympiads.

During the day our students were involved in a series of four heats where they were scored according to criteria that rewarded clear, concise, respectful discourse around interesting ethical cases.

Our wonderful senior ethics olympiad team discussed cases with St Kents College, Scots College (Wellington), Pukekohe High and Macleans College.

Coming up on Friday June 16th is the annual Philosophy Day. This is open to all students interested in spending the morning doing: fun thinking activities, discussing ethics and listening to experts from the group "Effective Altruism". On the 2nd of June, a small group of Pacific Island students went to Remuera Primary School to teach Year 6 students about their culture and traditional dances. The girls spoke about the significance of the Islands they come from, the symbolism on their flags and their traditional attire. The primary school students enjoyed the learning opportunity and participated by asking questions and learning about the Ma'ulu'ulu and Ura. As it was also Samoan Language Week, the primary school students were also taught about the theme of this year's week as well as the marking of Samoa's Independence.
