Te Ara a Kupe Beaton Scholarship

Congratulations to Epsom Girls Grammar School, Year 13 Student Anika Lomax. Anika has been awarded one of five Te Ara a Kupe Beaton Scholarships for 2023.

The Te Ara a Kupe Beaton Scholarship was set up in 2017 by Jamie Beaton of Crimson Education to help young Māori high school students access high-quality university education. Each winning student receives personalised mentoring and education services worth up to \$25,000 to help them apply for and get accepted into a university in New Zealand or overseas. Past winners have been admitted to the US top 10 universities, including two to Harvard and one to Duke University.

Quiz Night


