Today is the last day of the term. Thank you everyone for a great Term 2 and I hope everyone has a relaxing holiday.



BOARD OF TRUSTEES

As another busy term comes to a close I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the teaching and support staff for your on-going commitment across all facets of school life. It is also appropriate to acknowledge the additional workload of board members over this term as we prepare for the ERO review, finalise the masterplan, provide support for the current building projects and prepare for the strategic planning process in September. I appreciate the support from the trustees and your additional time and commitment this term.

The educational sector (like most sectors) is currently under a number of governmental reviews with recent media headlines highlighting the passion that exists within the education community. The review of 'Tomorrows Schools' and the role for board of trustees potentially changes the governance framework for schools across NZ. The review of NCEA seems to have created the most media attention and to date it appears the experts have had limited input which is frustrating. This needs to change to give any credibility to this particular review and ultimately give any substance to this student centric assessment regime.

As mentioned above the board and staff alike are well underway in the preparation for our ERO external review in early August. The consultation process of the masterplan is complete and is being finalised to incorporate into the strategic planning process. The building projects are progressing to plan with Pod 2 at Epsom House scheduled for completion late September. L Block is close to design phase and fundraising is well underway to support this refurbishment project. The community support is vital to ensure we can complete this project to the design level we envisage.

The Education Council Code of Professional Responsibility and Standards for the Teaching Profession have been finalised, and the School has integrated them into the teacher appraisal system this year. Formation of the new Code and Standards was a collaborative effort, including input from teachers, leaders and teaching experts to articulate the expectations and aspirations of the profession. The Board has also gone through the Education Update Act (2017) to consider its implications; one of which has been the introduction of a new policy on managing challenging behaviour and the use of physical restraint.

The board also accepted the resignation this term of Sarah Stenson after 16 years as Deputy Principal at EGGS. Sarah has openly expressed her goal to one day become a Principal and now has this challenge at Kelston Girls College. This is a great opportunity and the board



wishes Sarah all the very best. Losing a key member of staff is always a challenge however it creates a new opportunity and congratulations to Kate Slattery for her promotion to Deputy Principal. From a board's perspective the cultivation of new leaders is important and the school can be very proud of the fact that many of these leaders are sought after by other schools.

I wish everyone a safe and relaxing holiday and look forward to another busy term ahead.

NCEA Notices

A reminder that <u>NCEA fees</u> were due by the end of Term 2. The link has the fee structure for both Domestic and International students and information about how to apply for financial assistance if required/appropriate.

Our absolute **deadline for fees is Friday August 10th**; at which stage we will transfer all monies received to NZQA. After that date any outstanding fees will need to be paid directly to NZQA rather than via the school. Any outstanding fees at December 1st will incur a late processing fee from NZQA.

Can I get help to pay?

Financial Assistance can be applied for if you are unable to afford the fees. To get this help parents or caregivers must meet one of the following conditions:

- be receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit
- have a Community Services Card or have joint family income that qualifies for a Community Services Card
- have two or more children entered as candidates with fees more than \$200.

How do I get help to pay?

To get financial assistance please fill in a Financial Assistance form and give it to Mr Nowell, the Qualifications Manager. You can get this form from Student Support here at school or from the NZQA website at: www.nzqa.govt.nz/financialassistance

International fee-paying students are not eligible to apply for financial assistance.

2019 Course Selection, Tertiary Information Evening and Options Evening

This is the time of year where students and their families start looking ahead to consider the courses that they will select for 2018. On **Monday 23rd July**, the 2019 Course Selection booklets for students (Year 10 going into Year 11, Year 11 going into Year 12 and Year 12 going into Year 13) will be available on the school website under Curriculum/2019 Course Selection. Hard copies will also be available for reference in Student Support.

Students should use the Course Selection booklets as a guide in conjunction with the Career Education Pathways booklet to plan their future pathway making careful note of prerequisites and any tertiary requirements. To further support students in this process there will be a **Pathways Information Evening** in the school hall on **Thursday 26th July, 5.30 - 7.30pm** where tertiary providers will display their programmes and answer any questions.



On **Thursday 2nd August 6 - 7.30pm**, we invite students and families to attend the **Senior Options Evening**. Course information, examples of learning and curriculum displays will be available around the school in the various Learning Areas and staff will be on hand to answer questions. A support 'hub' will be set up in the library with specific presentations from the Careers Department and support available from your daughters Dean, Qualifications Manager and Deputy Principal responsible for each year level. Please keep an eye out for further detail about these two events. Students in Years 10, 11 and 12 may start making their selections from the **Monday 30th July** and must have made their selections by **8am on Monday 13th August**.

2018 Digital Exams

Epsom Girls Grammar School has been participating in the trial and use of Digital External Examinations for several years. Computer-based methods of assessment are a key area of development for NZQA as they have the goal of making all examinations (where appropriate) online by 2020. Last year hundreds of students successfully participated in digital examinations at EGGS in a range of subjects. This year students in Year 11 have the opportunity to sit their English exam digitally and students in Years 12 and 13 have the opportunity to sit their English and / or Classical Studies exam digitally. You will have received an email about this with a link to register. All registrations need to to be in by Wednesday 25th July.

Uniform Review Process

In 2017, we started a review process of the Epsom Girls Grammar School uniform. The review started with a consultation, with feedback being sought from students, staff and families. The initial consultation identified the importance of maintaining the traditions and identity of the school in the local community. Respondents also indicated a need for more options to meet the needs of our diverse community. A brief was developed which reflected the responses.

Proposals to our brief were submitted by a number of uniform suppliers and in January 2018 the Uniform Group were engaged to work with us. The Uniform Group also worked with students in the Year 13 Textiles design class to develop ideas for consideration. The textile design students also did further investigation of needs and their findings were fed back into the uniform development plan.

Throughout Term 2, 2018 we have displayed some of the possibilities to students, parents and members of the community. We have also provided presentations of the proposals to students and parents.

We have considered the feedback we received from the artwork and samples carefully and have responded positively to the recommendations in redefining the uniform and now plan to aim for the introduction of a new uniform in 2020. This will allow time for students and parents to see samples of the new uniform and will give us ample time for production deadlines in 2019 for stock to be available for the 2020 introduction.

The planned transition period process for introduction of the new uniform will be three years, with the current school uniform to be phased out by 2023.

Road Safety Update

Auckland Transport (AT) has begun road works on Manukau Road to install a controlled pedestrian crossing outside the school. This will give our students and other pedestrians a much safer crossing from school to the bus stops on Manukau Road.

We have been in consultation with AT for a few years trying to get this crossing installed. Work was started last week and it is scheduled to last for approximately four weeks.

PTA

The PTA is a group of parents, teachers and senior leaders supporting the school community. This is a great opportunity to be involved in the school. Everyone is welcome whenever they can make it. 

OGA NEWS WOMEN IN LAW Function

Upon leaving Epsom Girls Grammar School a significant number of students have gone on to a successful profession in law. It is particularly noteworthy that a number of female judges received their education at Epsom Girls, including the late Dame Augusta Wallace, NZ's first woman judge, appointed to the District Court in 1975.

On Wednesday 27th June 2018 a group of Alumnae working in law came together at the School to attend the "Women in Law" function, organised by the EGGS Old Girls Association, in association with Heather Ash and Dame Judith Potter. The idea behind it was to gather together EGGS alumnae who now work in the legal profession, as well as current students considering law as a career. Convivial and casual, it proved to be an incredibly inspiring evening for all.

Lawyer Heather Ash (Simpson Grierson) was MC for the event and presentations were made by six alumnae, all members of the Judiciary, both current and retired: Dame Judith Potter DNZM CBE, Retired High Court Judge; Heather Simpson, CNZM, Retired District Court Judge; Hannah Sargisson, Associate Judge; Vivienne Ullrich, QC, Retired Family Court Judge; Melanie Harland, Environmental Court Judge; Sarah Reeves, Maori Land Court Judge. Chief District Court Judge Jan-Marie Doogue was overseas and gave her apologies.

First up, Dame Judith honoured Dame Augusta Wallace and then each of the Judges present gave a highly insightful and motivating speech, outlining their path to the bench. No two roads were the same and it was all underpinned by a sense of passion and a calling they could not escape.

Dame Judith Potter was the final speaker; she believes women who follow a career in law do so with a proper sense of purpose and a belief in: justice; equality before the law; access to justice; and that our judicial system exists to serve the community in which we live.

Important key messages from the evening, especially for young women aspiring to a career in law:

- It is belief and purpose that makes for excellent female lawyers and judges into the future, beyond personal goals and ambitions.
- Female lawyers can have relationships, children and strong family connections without compromising or jeopardising their dreams.
- Having a sound secondary education platform and a common bond with colleagues working in the same profession is immensely valuable.
- A challenge or problem shared is often a problem spared women are good at this, especially those working in law.
- Women can overcome the odds to succeed in a male-dominated profession; alumnae from EGGS have proved this time and time again.
- Get involved in your profession be visible, be authentic, be confident; network, engage, learn.

With many thanks to Julie Goodyer, Heather Ash and Dame Judith Potter for organising and sponsoring this highly successful and enlightening event. Thanks also to Fiona Ryan for her input.

It's great to be able to bring current students together with Old Girls in this way and the OGA intends to hold more of these functions, focussing on different careers, professions, passions and areas of work.


