Two year 10 classes have been chosen at random and will be asked to complete a mathematics and science test on the morning of the 5th of April. The purpose of the study is to obtain current national and international information that will help improve the teaching and learning of mathematics and science in our country. Further detail will be provided to the students involved in the coming weeks.
