- Plan and deliver the Social Studies EGGS curriculum and junior Business curriculum in accordance with school and national requirements; likewise the EFS senior Social Studies component of the course;
- Competently and accurately assess student work for formative and summative purposes.
- Attend relevant department and staff meetings and contribute to discussions and planning
- Be a reflective classroom practitioner
- Contribute to shared teaching and learning resources within the Department
- Fulfil requirements in terms of reporting to parents on student achievement

- Ability to create effective and engaging learning opportunities through careful planning and resource creation
- Ability to effectively scaffold social science skills and conceptual understanding for diverse learner needs
