- Plan and deliver the curriculum in accordance with school and national requirements; accurately assess student work for formative and summative purposes.
- Have current experience in teaching junior Social Studies in a New Zealand setting
- Attend department and staff meetings and contribute to discussions and planning
- Actively participate in the school/department's professional development programme;
- Fulfill requirements in terms of reporting to parents on student achievement
